2nd Sunday of Lent**Year A****7th/8th March, 2020****When life changes.....**

Dear friends

It is good to be here. "I've often felt like that! Sometimes, when I've been comfortably tucked up in bed and am reluctant to get up –especially early on a cold dark morning. Or, when I've been enjoying a good holiday with my family or close friends. We wish the good times could continue forever. We say to ourselves, 'It's good to be here. Let's stay.' But duty calls. We have to face the, sometimes, tedious demands of work, the harsh realities of life. I expect you've all felt the same way.

So did the inner circle of the apostles on the Mount of the Transfiguration. There they saw Jesus in a new light. He gave them a glimpse of His divine majesty and glory. Not only that. Jesus showed them, and us, a glimpse of the glory we would share in the resurrection –if we followed Him.

Elijah and Moses appeared with Jesus on the mountain. Their presence with Jesus assured His closest followers that He was, indeed, fulfilling God's promises for His people. More than that, the Father endorsed Jesus' mission, with the words, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to Him!" No wonder Peter exclaimed, 'Lord, it is good to be here!'

But Jesus had other plans. He knew He must descend the mountain to face the horror of the cross. He couldn't avoid the whole purpose of His mission –to save the world from the power of evil and grant us eternal life and happiness. That, Jesus knew, could only be achieved through His crucifixion and resurrection.

And the disciples, what was their reaction to that change in Jesus? Hopefully, memory of seeing Jesus' glorious transfiguration would sustain their faith in Him when He seemed to be a defeated, broken failure. But no. No longer did they say, 'Lord, it is good to be here.' Instead, Peter disowned Jesus. And the rest of His hand-picked followers –His closest friends –deserted Him. That was when He most needed their support. For them it was bad, not good, to be there, with Jesus. And so they left Him.

And what about us? Hopefully, there will be times when God seems very close. Praying is easy and delightful. We find following Jesus fulfilling and reassuring. The Good News really does give us hope, with a sense of direction in our lives. These are very precious moments, when we feel the warmth of God's gift of love. They give us a glimpse of the happiness of heaven. We want them to last forever. And they will.

But not yet. These blessed moments of peace and tranquillity with God are like an oasis in the desert, or a holiday with friends. They are meant to refresh us so that we can have the strength to move into the rigours of what may seem like a harsh desert.

Like Peter, James and John we must take up our crosses and follow the crucified Christ. That is a real test of our loyalty and commitment to Him. Are we fair-weather friends who give up when the going gets tough? Certainly, we will be tempted to do that. We may seek to escape into what is easy and comfortable, rather than do what is right and demanding. But the way of the cross is the only path to glory –for Jesus and for us.

The transfiguration gives us a glimpse of where Christ is leading us –the happiness and glory of heaven. We must keep our sights set on that.

And we are not alone. Our crucified and risen Lord accompanies us on our journey through life. He says, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light," [Mat 11:28-30] –light and easy because the crucified Christ helps us carry it.

Even when life is difficult, and the cross we have to carry is heavy, we should still try to say, 'Lord it is good to be here.' Not that we want the pain, but because we believe that with Christ's support it can help us to reach the eternal life, happiness and glory of the resurrection. Then we will be able to rest in the Lord, and with Peter exclaim, "Lord, it is good to be here!" (Reflection taken from Fr. Isidore Clarke O.P.)

Rite of Christian initiation of Adults

As we enter Lent, the most intense period of preparation begins for those seeking Baptism at Easter. It is called the Period of Purification and Enlightenment.

Last Sunday all those adults in the Archdiocese hoping to be baptised at Easter gathered in the Cathedral of St Stephen to celebrate the Rite of Election or Enrolment. Bishop Ken Howell welcomed the catechumens, congratulated them on following the promptings of the Spirit and encouraged them to enter fully into the process of this time. Each of the catechumens then signed their name in the Book of the Elect. Tayla-Jay Flynn with her godparent, Karen Chandler took part in this ritual.

During the Sundays of Lent Tayla will be dismissed after the Intercessions to contemplate further the Word we have all just heard. On some Sundays Tayla, prayed over by the celebrant, will celebrate the Scrutinies (prayers to uncover all that is weak in Tayla and strengthen all that is upright, good and strong.) Also, prayers for strengthening Tayla against the enticement to evil and support for her as a child of the Light.

Let us all be renewed by these prayers as we journey with Tayla to Easter.

Message from the Archbishop and ACBC

I have decided on the following protocols which seem proportionate to the current understanding of the coronavirus and the risks outlined by health authorities in this State:

- Parishes should refrain from distributing Holy Communion from the chalice until further notice, with a reminder to the faithful that Christ is fully present under either species.
- All ministers of Holy Communion should wash their hands before and after distributing, and provision should be made for this.
- When exchanging the Sign of Peace, people should avoid shaking hands but say "Peace be with you" with some eye contact and perhaps an appropriate gesture.
- Holy water should be temporarily removed from fonts at the doors of churches, though still be available for people to take home.
- Parishes and other settings where liturgies are celebrated should make alcohol-based gels or rubs (or like products) available near the entrances.

It would be preferable and perhaps prudent for people to receive Holy Communion in the hand rather than on the tongue, but the decision on this is left with the communicant at this stage.

The Archdiocese will continue to monitor the situation closely and provide further advice as required.

In the meantime we pray fervently that the threat of COVID-19 will ease, that those suffering from the virus will be cured and that those working for its relief will be strengthened.
