The Dilemma; Family First or Jesus First?

The reading from Matthew 10:37-42 seems hard and unreasonable. We see Jesus telling his apostles that anyone who prefers mother or father to Him is not worthy of Him. His same teaching applies to parents with children. Then Jesus goes on to warn that those who refuse to take up their cross and follow Him are also not worthy of Him and finally He warns against those who are living the 'good Life'.

Jesus makes it clear that those who wish to follow Him must renounce themselves. The road to salvation will not be an easy one.

Perhaps we should look at the context of today's gospel where Jesus is addressing His apostles. The seriousness of this discourse sees Matthew naming the twelve and identifying who they are. Then Jesus sends them on their mission, telling them when to go, what to do, how to do it and what will or will not happen.

The tasks are not appealing; they may be persecuted, but this must not stop them from speaking. Despite the risks, Jesus tells them to be fearless and speak out. He lets them know of the downside if they do not.

Jesus then tells his apostles that he has not come to bring peace to the world but dissension, and that is the lead up to today's gospel. How and why? The final two verses apply to us. We noted at Pentecost last month, Jesus breathed on His disciples filling them with the Holy Spirit. As we, the confirmed, go out with the Good News, be mindful that we too are filled with the Holy Spirit, so let us be careful and prayerful in what we say.

We may be the only bible some people will ever read. As we preach the Kingdom of God, practically or verbally, we know that Our Lord's message is both radical and urgent. May Matthew's closing lines telling us the value of even a cup of cold water, given in Christ's name, will soften the frightening lines given at the start. Our efforts will be rewarded generously by our Saviour, on the other side of the grave.

Romans 6:3–4, 8–11

When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life.

But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised from the dead will never die again. Death has no power over him any more. When he died, he died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.

Matthew 10:37–42


Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it.'

'Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me.'

'Anyone who welcomes a prophet because he is a prophet will have a prophet's reward; and anyone who welcomes a holy man because he is a holy man will have a holy man's reward.'

'If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is a disciple, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.'

In today's Gospel reading Jesus says that if you give one of these to a little one because they are His disciple you will be rewarded. What is it? Connect the dots to find out!

SUNDAY MASSES

WEEKDAY MASSES

Weekday masses have recommenced on Thursday at St Agnes' and on Friday at St Joachim's, both commencing 9:00am. Bookings must be made prior to attending Mass. Due to registration sheets needing to be printed registrations close at 4:00pm on the Wednesday and Thursday respectfully.

THIS PROCESS WILL NEED TO CONTINUE UNTIL THE GOVERNMENT ADVISES THAT CONTACT TRACING IS NO LONGER REQUIRED.

HOW TO BOOK

A TryBooking page has been opened to facilitate the booking of masses. All you need to do is click on your preferred venue:

and complete the online booking:

1. Select **Book Now**
2. Choose Mass, press **Select**
3. Choose Section you wish to sit in, press **Select**
4. Add tickets required, press **Next**
5. Fill our details for each person attending, complete **all** fields, press **Next**
6. Complete Booking details, this must be completed to finalise booking, press **Purchase**
7. If your booking is successful you will receive an email within a few minutes.

If you do not get a confirmation email or you have difficulty making a booking please the parish office. We will assist you. **If you do not have access to the internet please ring the parish office and we will make the booking for you.**
