Desert Experience??

As human beings we all pass through a kind of desert experience, especially during this pandemic time. I was feeling so dry last year when I journeyed through the Easter season, there were no public masses, no celebrations, I missed all the smiling faces in the church etc. Each year on this first Sunday of Lent, we read one of the synoptic accounts of the temptations of Jesus in the desert by Satan.

The same Spirit who descended on Jesus in his baptism now drives him into the desert for forty days. This is a moment of radical confrontation with Satan who wants to frustrate the work of God. The wild beasts represent the danger of the desert, and the angels remind us of the angel who supplied food for Elijah in the wilderness (1 King 19:5-7). In the desert, Jesus faces good and evil, but his obedience brings forth the new people of God where Israel's rebellion had brought death and alienation.

The word of God reminds us of the 40 days of Jesus' struggle in the desert. This experience of Jesus gives us an imprint of truth about fulfilment – that every achievement or triumph one can attain always has its underlying 'rupture' behind. The 40 days in the wilderness of Jesus is his experience of abandonment or rupture. They were days of tests, temptations, loneliness, an internal "annihilation."

Imaginably, we too experience such 'ruptures' in life in its various 'palms and faces.' They are present even among and within our families and society – sufferings, poverty, hunger, injustice – even if they dawn on others as mere 'human reality' where only disgust and mediocrity remain its viable responses. But what does it bring to us? What is the purpose of the 'wilderness' in our life?

Along this line of thought, in Jesus' perspective, the wilderness is the time and space where things became crystal clear – his priorities, his mission – the love of the Father far beyond imagining. It was the source of his inspiration, firm dedication and unwavering commitment. In the same way, our own share of 'wilderness' should also aid us in "moving on" in our life. It is not a reason for us to be immobile; on the contrary, it should rather transform us and make us "active" in fulfilling our role in the lives of others and in Kingdom of God as we move on to experience the great Joy of our faith.

Go to Joseph with extreme confidence, because I do not remember having asked anything from St. Joseph, without having obtained it readily.

READINGS FOR 4TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading

Genesis 9:8-15

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.


MONDAY MORNING MASS


