Listen to him...

To contemplate the scene of transfiguration we need to go up the mountain with Jesus, leaving behind our worries and concerns. I wonder how much pain and risk people take at this time to come to church. There is always something that invites and attract us to be in his presence, is it so? On the mountain Jesus' appeared to Peter James and John in all his glory, as the Son of God. Of course, God presents to us in different forms and shapes through various people and situations around us. Peter wanted to hold on to that experience and stay on the mountain, offering to build a few tents. Yes, it's always easy for us to remain in our comfort zones. But you have to face the realities of life in connection with the divine experiences.

It was while he was praying to his heavenly father that Jesus was transfigured. The same can be the case for us. It is in His presence that we realize who we are and where we belong. Each time we pray and seek in communion with the Father, we too can experience being transfigured or transformed by God's presence. Very real change can take place when we encounter Christ in our prayer. Prayer can change anything in the world. An inner transformation can take place as our faith; hope and love are restored or renewed. And even a physical change can happen: the glow returns to our eye, we smile again, and our shoulders are no longer weighed down.

Jesus' communion with his Father in prayer at the time of the Transfiguration strengthens him to face the cross. We too need experiences of tasting heaven on earth in order to face the challenges of the cross in our own life.

SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN & VULNERABLE ADULTS PREVENTION AND PROTECTION POLICY

... for it is to such as thee that the kingdom of God belongs.

The Archdiocese of Brisbane holds that children, young people and vulnerable adults are a gift from God with an intrinsic right to dignity of life, respect and security from physical and emotional harm. They are to be treasured, nurtured and safeguarded by all.

This means that everyone in the church must ensure that the fundamental rights of children, young people and vulnerable adults are respected. This will be achieved through the development of respectful relationships and a commitment to safety embracing appropriate boundaries, behaviours and practices, in accordance with the Archdiocesan Code of Ethical Behaviour and adherence to legislative imperatives of the State.

This policy applies to Clergy, Religious, Staff, Parishioners, Volunteers, Students on placement and Visitors to our sites.

READINGS FOR 4TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading

Genesis 22:1-2, 9-13, 15-18

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham,' he called. 'Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.'

When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son.

But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. Abraham took the ram and offered it as a burnt offering in place of his son.

The angel of the Lord called Abraham a second time from heaven. 'I swear by my own self – it is the Lord who speaks – because you have done this, because you have not refused me your son, your only son, I will shower blessings on you, I will make your descendants as many as the stars of heaven and the grains of sand on the seashore. Your descendants shall gain possession of the gates of your enemies. All the nations of the earth shall bless themselves by your descendants, as a reward for your obedience.'

Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them anymore but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.

Margaret, 39, is a teacher at a vocational school for deaf students in the Solomon Islands. She was born deaf, so she knows the challenges it poses to education and employment. The school faced water

shortages that left them without safe water for drinking, cooking, washing and growing vegetables. Then Tropical Cyclone Harold caused damage as the threat of COVID-19 loomed. With Caritas Australia's support, the school installed water tanks, provided cyclone-proof building materials, and helped to implement COVID-19 prevention measures and is now planning to boost food security through increased agricultural production.
