Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord Year B

27th/28th March, 2021

Hosanna to the Son of David

I am sure that many of us cannot believe how quickly this time of Lent has passed, even in these difficult and uncertain times. Perhaps we feel that, with all the restrictions, we have journeyed through Lent with a new intensity. Whatever the case, it is certainly a Lent that we will remember! Perhaps now, we can reflect upon all the many and rich symbols that we associate with Holy Week and Easter.

This weekend we will praise Jesus the King, remembering Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. Palm Sunday is a strange festival. It's a celebration of Jesus as King, but even as we celebrate, we are conscious that the next part of the story gives us some extra perspective. The crowds cheered and lauded Jesus as he entered Jerusalem; the same crowds seemed to turn on him when he was not the military conqueror they expected.

Lent is a good time to be asking, what is our mental or emotional picture of God? It is a time to think about what we are expecting from Him. And crises are an especially good time to be asking that question.

Palm Sunday confronts us with God being disruptively different. God the revolutionary. We see God who takes on the pain, who walks the journey of Holy Week, deeper and deeper into a darkness we cannot enter. God, in Jesus lets his friends deny and betray him, God, in Jesus, suffers rejection and abuse, and the ultimate desolation of a lonely yet innocent death. All the worst of human experience is heaped on Jesus.

Again the Gospel on Palm Sunday which recounts what Jesus has done for us, is not just some distant story, or something remote from us. It is about our salvation and our life. We are not just passive spectators, or onlookers, or listeners: all that we recall on Palm Sunday is about what Jesus has done for us and does for us right now. This is such a welcomed message as we continue to try and do our best in the strange and difficult situation that we face at the moment. The opening address at the Mass expresses this very well: "...with all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the Lord's entry into the city for our salvation, following in his footsteps, so that, being made by his grace partakers of the cross, we may have a share also in his Resurrection and in his life."

READINGS FOR PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Gospel

Mark 11:1-10

When they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, and said to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat; untie it and bring it.

If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" say, "The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately". And they went away, and found a colt tied at the door out in the open street; and they untied it.

And those who stood there said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' And they told them what Jesus had said; and they let them go. And they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their garments on it; and he sat upon it.

And many spread their garments on the road, and others spread leafy branches which they had cut from the fields. And those who went before and those who followed cried out, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is coming!

Hosanna in the highest!'

Isaiah 50:4-7

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue.

So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech.

Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple.
