Arise and Shine

Was it just an off-handed compliment. Or was it an action that seemed meaningless at the time. That moment of service that required almost no energy and took less than 30 seconds. You found out later how deep the impact was. You learned how that one moment changed the life of another person. While it meant nothing to you, it meant everything to them. Sometimes the little things make the biggest difference. The Kingdom is built on little things.

In listening to the Gospel proclaimed, it can be easy to get caught up in the agricultural analogies and miss the incredible message that Jesus is offering. We often think that the big things are going to build the Kingdom. It's the giant event that helped a teenager encounter Christ or the amazing talk we prepared. Certainly those things play an important role and can be starting points and even places where conversion begins. But often, many of us focus too much on the big things. We put all of our energy into planning out the retreat and don't have time to grab coffee with a teenager that needs to talk. We are rushing around preparing for an Edge or Life Night, and forget to welcome the young person that is new.

Those little moments we miss make the biggest difference. They build the Kingdom. They are the mustard seed that we plant and Christ magnifies those actions and makes them abundant. We need to work on the big things in our ministry, but not at the expense of the little moments of relational ministry. Not at the expense of that 30-second conversation that makes all the difference.

Small actions grow into something big. There are big moments in ministry, but they require the small moments first. That teen/adult you welcomed when she was new probably won't tell you that she is struggling with her parents' divorce right away – that big conversation starts with a little one. The teen thinking about the priesthood probably won't welcome your insight into his discernment until you've walked with him on his journey of faith. You can't lead a teenager closer to Christ without taking the small moment to learn a teenager's name.

Where are you spending your energy? Are you too focused on the big moments, or are you attentive to the small ways that Christ is calling you to serve? Are you planting mustard seeds that will grow into something amazing, or trying to replant cedar trees on a hilltop? This week, be attentive to the small parts of your ministry – and get ready to see some Kingdom size results.

Mark 4: 26-34

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.

SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN & VULNERABLE ADULTS PREVENTION AND PROTECTION POLICY

The Archdiocese of Brisbane holds that children, young people and vulnerable adults are a gift from God with an intrinsic right to dignity of life, respect and security from physical and emotional harm. They are to be treasured, nurtured and safeguarded by all.

This means that everyone in the church must ensure that the fundamental rights of children, young people and vulnerable adults are respected. This will be achieved through the development of respectful relationships and a commitment to safety embracing appropriate boundaries, behaviours and practices, in accordance with the Archdiocesan Code of Ethical Behaviour and adherence to legislative imperatives of the State. This policy applies to Clergy, Religious, Staff, Parishioners, Volunteers, Students on placement and Visitors to
