Courage, He is calling you...

Can you imagine the challenges of a blind person? How deep and frustrating it can be. I had the privilege to visit Miner's Heritage and participate in Australia's Largest Walk-In Underground Sapphire Mine Tour during my recent holidays near Emerald. After the mine entry & underground showroom were completed Miners Heritage was officially opened for its first tour in 1984. A short tour that is fun for all ages, explore the dark depths of the mine as you embrace the sparkling walls of sapphires that surround you. After an explanation the guide turned off all the lights for a while at a depth of 17 metre and you could feel the depth of darkness in the underground.

Bertsimaeus, the blind beggar is sitting on the side of the road doing his business while Jesus passes. He heard that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by, and that was enough for him. He might otherwise have told himself that Jesus was leaving Jericho and could not stop for a poor blind beggar. But that is not how faith thinks. Faith says, "Now is the time! This is my opportunity! If Jesus is leaving Jericho, I must act now! This may be my only chance!"

Blindness can create big troubles in our lives. I believe that Jesus talks here more on our spiritual blindness rather physical disability. This can be a danger in our own personal life as well. We read in the psalm 146:8 that the Lord opens the eyes of the blind, the Lord raises up those who are bowed down... God opens our eyes to see him clearly.

The blind Bertehamues were scolded by people and said to be quite. There would be so many 'stop signs' or discouraging facts just like the crowd in our faith lives. These are the challenges that we may face in our faith journey currently. What do you think about your faith challenges, these can be anything that questions your faith; just like illness, disbelief, positions, power, money, despair thoughts, time, discouragement, loss of trust in the church, sports..... There would be even people who say NO church Why God... etc.

Amidst hundreds of reasons why not to believe, we need only one thing, an encouraging word; such as **courage, get up, He is calling you...** which may come from different sources; maybe from our parents, partners, friends, teachers, church or any number of situations. Let's not forget the vocation that has been given to us through our baptism; that is to the proclaim and lead others into God's experience in our lives.

What about you? How many times has Christ not only passed by you, but knocked at your door, and called out to you? Time and again he has invited you.

Dear friends each and every time God asks us 'what do you want me to do for you' what is our response? The blind man asked 'Master, let me see again.' Yes, we need faith to open our lives... and Jesus appreciates this faith. Let's ask God to open our hearts and minds to have a clear sight to know and love him.

'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.


