My Parish, My Dream....

Dear Parishioners and friends;

As you may be aware, the **National Centre for Pastoral Research** conducted a mass attendance count across every catholic parish in Australia in May 2021. The result of this showed the significant impact COVID-19 has had on mass attendances. Our parish mass attendance decreased by about 30-40%. This is a comparatively good result and it speaks of our ability to continue to engage with our parishioners in difficult times.

The number of people attending our Masses regularly is important because it reflects on the continuation of our faith and faith is reflected in people. As your parish priest, **my mission is people**. The **Pastoral Council** is currently working on a Parish Plan covering the next three years. The Council and I agree that if we don't plan for growth now, our numbers may well shrink further, and our Parish may eventually be forced into closure. Fortunately, we are blessed with the presence of our two primary schools and a college being great resources of faith and support....but that may well not be enough.

I am certain that you would want to join with me in wanting our parish to remain alive, strong, and well. As such I am now asking for your assistance in the planning for our future.

My question to you is simply this:

How do you think our Parish can prosper and grow stronger?

This week we will begin a process that will lead our parish towards the development of a 3-year strategic plan. **Planning** is the most important initial task in our development as we look more intently at becoming a centre of building a culture of welcome and mission. We all want a parish that is growing, that is thriving, a place where everyone belongs. A place where everyone is loved. A place where many hands are at work, sharing the tasks, sharing individual strengths, and people sharing the passion of their faith as servants of God.

And so now, I ask you all... please, be involved! As an integral part of our Parish planning, we are partnering with **Evangelisation Brisbane (EB)**, one of the agencies of the Archdiocese, for the drawing-up of our strategic plan. The first step in this process asks us all - what should be possible in each of the ministries requiring support.

To assist us with this there will be a "Dreaming Video" at each weekend Mass over the next 6 weekends. The purpose of this is to explore with you what could be possible. In summary, let us remember that every parish from time to time requires 'refreshing'. Now is our time.

For many, the challenges of involvement may not be easy.

But if done properly and with the right intention and support, it will bring new life, new growth, and new hope to our community.

READINGS FOR THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

1st Reading

Apostles 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Responsorial Psalm

Response: God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

All peoples, clap your hands, cry to God with shouts of joy!

For the Lord, the Most High, we must fear, great king over all the earth.

God goes up with shouts of joy; the Lord goes up with trumpet blast.

Second Reading

Hebrews 9:24-28. 10:19-23

It is not as though Christ had entered a man-made sanctuary which was only modelled on the real one; but it was heaven itself, so that he could appear in the actual presence of God on our behalf. And he does not have to offer himself again and again, like the high priest going into the sanctuary year after year with the blood that is not his own, or else he would have had to suffer over and over again since the world began. Instead of that, he has made his appearance once and for all, now at the end of the last age, to do away with sin by sacrificing himself. Since men only die once, and after that comes judgement, so Christ, too, offers himself only once to take the faults of many on himself, and when he appears a second time, it will not be to deal with sin but to reward with salvation those who are waiting for him.

In other words, brothers, through the blood of Jesus we have the right to enter the sanctuary, by a new way which he has opened for us, a living opening through the curtain, that is to say, his body. And we have the supreme high priest over all the house of God. So as we go in, let us be sincere in heart and filled with faith, our minds sprinkled and free from any trace of bad conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us keep firm in the hope we profess, because the one who made the promise is faithful.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.

'And now I am sending down to you what the Father has promised. Stay in the city then, until you are clothed with the power from on high.' Then he took them out as far as the outskirts of Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. Now as he blessed them, he withdrew from them and was carried up to heaven. They worshipped him and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy; and they were continually in the Temple praising God.
