Spreading Joy and Peace in the Christmas Season

Advent is the beginning of the Church Year. The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival." The focus of the entire season is preparation to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ in advent. It is celebrating a truth about God, the revelation of God in Christ. Advent also symbolises the spiritual journey of individuals and a congregation, as they affirm that Christ has come, that He is present in the world today, and that He will come again in power.

The Colours of Advent

Historically, the primary sanctuary colour of Advent is Purple. This is the colour of penitence and fasting as well as the colour of royalty to welcome the Advent of the King.

The Advent Wreath

This is an increasingly popular symbol of the beginning of the Church year in many churches as well as homes. It is a circular evergreen wreath with five candles, four around the wreath and one in the centre. The circle of the wreath reminds us of God Himself, His eternity and endless mercy, which has no beginning or end. The green of the wreath speaks of the hope that we have in God, the hope of newness, of renewal, of eternal life.

The Advent Candles

The Candles symbolise the light of God coming into the world through the birth of His son. The four outer candles represent the period of waiting during the four Sundays of Advent, which themselves symbolize the four centuries of waiting between the prophet Malachi and the birth of Christ.

The first Sunday of advent, we light one candle, symbolising HOPE. An expectation of what to come. The second Sunday of advent we light two candles, the second one symbolising LOVE, sometimes called Bethlehem candle. Third Sunday of advent we light three candles, the third one, the rose candle, symbolising JOY. The fourth Sunday of advent we light the four candles, the fourth one symbolising PEACE, sometimes called Angel's candle.

I hope and pray that this Christmas season will bring us more healing, joy, strength and hope as we journey together as family and community.

READINGS FOR 1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

1st Reading

Isaiah 2:1-5

The vision of Isaiah son of Amoz, concerning Judah and Jerusalem.
In the days to come the mountain of the Temple of the Lord
shall tower above the mountains and be lifted higher than the hills.
All the nations will stream to it, peoples without number will come to it; and they
will say:

‘Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord,
to the Temple of the God of Jacob
that he may teach us his ways
so that we may walk in his paths;
since the Law will go out from Zion,
and the oracle of the Lord from Jerusalem.’

He will wield authority over the nations and adjudicate between many peoples;
these will hammer their swords into ploughshares, their spears into sickles.
Nation will not lift sword against nation, there will be no more training for war.
O House of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this
when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one
left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

‘So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming.
You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time
of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would
not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you
too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not
expect.’
