Dear friends and parishioners

So here we are. Almost Christmas, most of us have spent the last several weeks getting ready. Trees bought and decorated. Gifts bought and wrapped. Holiday parties. Family gatherings. Cookies left out for Santa. Cards and letters sent far and wide. All wonderful.

It is that time of the year again where all of us can hear carols on the streets, see a bountiful feast served on our tables and receive a lot of gifts that can be seen under the tree. There is a song which goes....

Little Baby in a Manger, I love you,
Coming down to Earth a stranger, I love you,
Wise men saw the star and answered I love you,
Little baby in a manger I love you.

The song was childlike, but the truth was evident, Jesus, a baby born of humble stature was unknown by the very world He helped to create. He was there when God created all things, yet he chose to step down out of heaven to live a human life. Hence The Word became flesh and dwelt among us!

When it says we have seen His glory it reminds me that His glory is all around. The sky, stars, moon, nature, all growing things all shout that a divine creator made them. The wise men saw the star and the glory of God. We too can look all around us and see God's glory from the cry of a newborn child to the strength of a thunderstorm. His power and glory are evident.

Saint Chrysostom says “But if ‘He gives light to every person coming into the world,’ how is it that so many continue unenlightened? For not all have known the majesty of Christ. How then does He give light to every man? He gives light to all as far as in him lies. But if some who are unwilling should close the eyes of their mind, and refuse the rays of this light, their darkness is not from the nature of the light, but their own wickedness when they turn themselves away from the light.”

Christmas is the season of celebrating the birth of our Saviour and our Light, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God who can save us from all darkness. Saint Gregory of Nyssa: “We shall become as the light, in our nearness to Christ’s true light, if we leave this dark atmosphere of the earth and dwell above; and we shall be light, as our Lord says if the true light that shines in the dark comes down even to us - unless, that is, any filthiness of sin spreading over our hearts should dim the brightness of our light.” United are those who believe in Him and His teachings. Christmas is also remembering His example and giving thanks to His sacrifices – He died on the cross and was resurrected so that we could be forgiven of our sins. Rejoice in Him, thank Him and Remember His love for mankind always.

So God with us. Not God over us. Not God judging us. Not God condemning us. God with us in this wonderful, complex, sorrowful, joyful thing we call life. God with you and me. God with us and them. God here. God now. Just as you are. Just as we are. Just as they are.

1st Reading

The Lord spoke to Ahaz and said, 'Ask the Lord your God for a sign for yourself coming either from the depths of Sheol or from the heights above.' 'No', Ahaz answered 'I will not put the Lord to the test.'

Then Isaiah said:

'Listen now, House of David:

are you not satisfied with trying the patience of people without trying the patience of my God, too?

The Lord himself, therefore, will give you a sign.

It is this: the maiden is with child and will soon give birth to a son whom she will call Immanuel, a name which means "God-is-with-us".'

Responsorial Psalm

Response: Let the Lord enter; he is king of glory.

The Lord's is the earth and its fullness, the world and all its peoples.

It is he who set it on the seas; on the waters he made it firm.

Who shall climb the mountain of the Lord? Who shall stand in his holy place?

Second Reading

Romans 1:1-7

From Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus who has been called to be an apostle, and specially chosen to preach the Good News that God promised long ago through his prophets in the scriptures.

This news is about the Son of God, who, according to the human nature he took, was a descendant of David: it is about Jesus Christ our Lord who, in the order of the spirit, the spirit of holiness that was in him, was proclaimed Son of God in all his power through his resurrection from the dead. Through him we received grace and our apostolic mission to preach the obedience of faith to all pagan nations in honour of his name. You are one of these nations, and by his call belong to Jesus Christ. To you all, then, who are God's beloved in Rome, called to be saints, may God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send grace and peace.

Matthew 1:18-24

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.' Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son
and they will call him Emmanuel,

a name which means 'God-is-with-us'. When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home.
