Preaching Conversion Response

Preaching. What is the first sermon that Jesus ever preached? You might be tempted to say repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand. In fact, if we think of how it was said of Saint Francis that we are called to preach to all of creation and if necessary use words -we can better look at Jesus' actions to see how he preached in where he went first. We are told he went to Zebulun and Neftali which for most of us doesn't mean much, but for every Jew would've been very significant. They would've known that it was here in the north of Israel that 10 of the twelve tribes of Israel were lost in the Assyrian exile which devastated them and took them prisoners about 700 years before Christ. Since that time hope had been lost that the 12 tribes of Israel would ever be able to continue or the promise of God be fulfilled.

When Jesus began with the last tribes, precisely in Zebulun and Neftali it was seen as a messianic move. This is why God always goes after the lost sheep -those who are on the fringes of society, the weak and brings them the good news - that is why we hear Isaiah's prophecy fulfilled - that light has shown in the darkness. A quick look at the Bible shows us the same - that Moses who was a murderer and David who was a murderer and adulterer and Paul who was a murderer, all become great examples of God going after those who are lost in order to convert them. This is the good news in which the medium is the message - that God calls those who are weak and lost to become saints and apostles.

Conversion - Repent because the kingdom of heaven is at hand simply means that we are called to turn away from anything that prevents us from loving God fully and authentically. Although change is hard we need only open our heart and ask our God to help us to respond to the grace that God freely gives in order to choose to love.

Response- God is calling us too today, just as he did with the disciples, in the very concrete situation of our life in the middle of our daily routine right where we work. It doesn't happen in a church or while we are praying but rather in *media res*, that is, in the middle of things. Our response is key here as we are called to drop our nets to respond immediately to follow. Unfortunately, many of us are entangled in the nets of the world. What is it that holds me back today from truly following Jesus whole heartedly? What unfreedom prevents me from being all God's and belonging to him?

Second Reading

1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17

I appeal to you, brothers, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, to make up the differences between you, and instead of disagreeing among yourselves, to be united again in your belief and practice. From what Chloe's people have been telling me, my dear brothers, it is clear that there are serious differences among you. What I mean are all these slogans that you have, like: 'I am for Paul', 'I am for Apollos', 'I am for Cephas', 'I am for Christ'. Has Christ been parcelled out? Was it Paul that was crucified for you? Were you baptised in the name of Paul?

For Christ did not send me to baptise, but to preach the Good News, and not to preach that in the terms of philosophy in which the crucifixion of Christ cannot be expressed.

Hearing that John had been arrested Jesus went back to Galilee, and leaving Nazareth he went and settled in Capernaum, a lakeside town on the borders of Zebulun and Naphtali. In this way the prophecy of Isaiah was to be fulfilled:

Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali!

Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan, Galilee of the nations!

The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned.

From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew; they were making a cast in the lake with their net, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.' And they left their nets at once and followed him.

Going on from there he saw another pair of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they were in their boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. At once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him.

He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people.
